Alexander (Alex) John Weaver, 79, of Ephrata, Washington passed away on Tuesday, October 26, 2021.

Alex was born in International Falls Minnesota in 1942 to his parents Delores and Alexander E. Weaver. He also lived in Detroit Michigan and Moses Lake Washington.

He had five younger brothers: Jack, Pat, Mike, Bill, and Bob.

Alex graduated from Little Fork High School in Minnesota the class of 1960. He enlisted in the Army and was assigned to the 37th Howitzer Battalion.
