Delores Jean Pearce, 89, of Stratford, Washington, passed away peacefully on October 12, 2020, at Samaritan Hospital in Moses Lake, Washington.

Delores was born in Wenatchee, Washington, on April 22, 1931, to Ralph and Virginia Brashear. She was the second of four children.

Delores grew up in Ephrata, Washington, graduating from Ephrata High School in 1950.

While attending a dance at the Adrian Grange Hall in 1948, she met Claude Pearce. But, as Delores was only a sophomore in high school, she would have to wait two years until after graduation to marry Claude. They wed on June 25, 1950. From that day forward they were never very far apart. They enjoyed doing everything together.

Delores took an active role on the farm, driving wheat truck during harvest, picking rocks, hoeing weeds, or running after parts for the farm. But! Her main job was housekeeping and cooking, and man could she cook! Anything from 4:00 am hunting morning breakfast, to harvest meals, to family gatherings. Equipment dealers, fertilizer sales people, or friends passing by, seemed to always time their visits around lunch time, knowing they would end up with their feet under the kitchen table.

Delores was preceded in death by her husband Claude, her parents Ralph and Virginia Brashear, and her brother Garry Brashear.

Delores is survived by two brothers, Stanley (Jeannette) Brashear of Everett, Washington, and Doug Brashear of Stratford, Washington; her four children, Sandy (Melaine) Pearce and Jerry (Lorry) Pearce of Stratford, Washington, Jim (Betty) Pearce and Claudia (Howard) Pfeifer of Wilson Creek, Washington; special friend Katy Morley and her daughters, Sarah and Martha; 16 grandchildren, 26 great-grandchildren, and numerous nieces and nephews. Delores will be greatly missed by all.
