Richard Allen Kinart passed away peacefully at his home surrounded by family on May 17th at the age of 77.

Dick was born on January 23, 1939 in Dunlap, Iowa. He graduated from Washougal High School in 1957 and later attended Central Washington University, where he played football and earned his Master's degree. He began his career in education as a teacher at Waitsburg, Washington. He then became an administrator at Newport, Oregon, Tumwater, Washington and Ephrata. Before retirement he served as a superintendent for eleven years with the Ephrata School District.

Dick was an avid outdoorsman, enjoying hunting, fishing, and sports. He will always be remembered as an unselfish, caring person, who encouraged others to strive to reach their own potential.

Dick is survived by his wife, Andrea Kinart of Moses Lake. His daughters are Heidi Bazaldua (Ben), and Holly Swem (Steve), plus six grandchildren, Brett Bazaldua (Kelsey), Brianna Bazaldua, Brooke Bazaldua, Brennen Bazaldua, Kaden Kolves, and Kyler Kolves.
