On April 9th 2021, Frank W Craig 57 unexpectedly passed away at his home in Soap Lake, Washington.

He lived in Renton until 2017 before buying a house and moving to Soap Lake with visions of relaxing in the sun and sitting on his porch enjoying the view. If you got him on a roll about his time in the Boys Scouts, HS sports, jets, old cars, anything he did throughout his life, or his son he could talk about it for hours, he always had a story or at a minimum random fact (he would often blurt something out mid conversation and follow it up with “More useless knowledge”, “side note”, or “FYI”) but whether it was a story or “useless” fact he wanted to share it and it always made him smile to do so.

Frank is survived by his son Dylan, his parents Charles and Waneda and his siblings Tina and Kevin. As well as through the many stories soon to be shared with his grandson Corey W Craig.
