I am the captain of the Seattle Cossacks Motorcycle stunt & Drill Team & had the pleasure of meeting Bob several years ago as I came out of our hotel to prepare for our performance in the Sage-N-Sun parade. Bob shared his stories of his time in the team from 1939 until the start of WW2. He even had his outstanding rider trophy with him dated Dec. 6th, 1941 (the night before the attack on Pearl Harbor). The team temporarily disbanded during the war & his parents sold his motorcycle while he was serving in the Coast Guard. When he returned home, after the war, he moved to Ephrata & wasn’t aware the team had gotten back together until he saw an article in the local paper that the Seattle Cossacks were going to be in the parade. There wasn’t a single team member that didn’t enjoy our visit with Bob, one of our brothers. Once a Cossack always a Cossack. Rest In Peace Bob💕
