Virginia Louise Jorgensen was born Virginia Peck in Moses Lake, Washington, on October 9, 1956. She went by the nickname Ginger and passed away suddenly January 15, 2020.

Ginger attended school in Warden and later in Bothell, Washington. Returning to Warden after graduation she worked as a waitress, a cook and a police dispatcher. When Mount. St. Helens erupted in 1980, she remembered well how she was swamped with calls asking if it was the end of the world.

Ginger moved to Coulee City in 1987 and married Allen Jorgensen. She lived on their family farm ever since, except for a few years when she owned and operated Grandpa Joe's Restaurant & Horseshoe Lounge in Coulee City (now the Last Stand Dinner).

Ginger enjoyed cooking, whether it was making lunches for a harvest crew, or catering for the annual Edgemon family reunion. She also loved to can fruit and vegetables in the fall. She was a member of St. Andrews Grange, and was instrumental in getting the beautiful mural that adorns the outside of the St. Andrews Grange Hall.

Ginger is survived by her husband, Allen Jorgensen at home; her two sons, Branden and Travis; her grandson, Landon, and a sister, Della Alley, all of Coulee City. She is also survived by a brother, George Hinton in Nickerson, Kansas.
